## Raise Money for Your Organization

A portion of the donation money you collect can be returned to your organization, if you qualify. Get details from your local Lions Club, Lioness Club, Leo Club or the Lions of Illinois Foundation.

## How You Can Participate...

**Individual Run/Walkers** - Collect your donations and join other walkers who are supporting the same cause: "We Run/Walk ... To Light The Way!"

**Teams**- Why not join forces, whether it's at work or home or your club or organization and form your own team for the "Walk for Sight". What a great way to show your combined support as well as share in the fun of the day.

**Lioness, Leo & Lion Club Teams** - A group of walkers (Club members, family, friends) representing your Lions Club.

**Organization Teams** - A group of walkers representing the same organization - for example: a high school, junior high, church group, scout troop, a school band, youth group or local booster club. What a great way to earn "Community Service" points and at the same time, raise money for your organization, up to 50% for non lion clubs can be requested to be returned to your organization.

*Note: You can only belong to one team.*

## Registration & Donation Form

Walkers, groups, and organizations need to register through their local Lions Club, Lioness Club, Leo Club, or direct with the Lions of Illinois Foundation. All registration forms, with donation money collected, should be turned in prior to the "Run/Walk for Sight" event. Each run/walker is encouraged to collect at least \$100 in donations.

All checks must be made payable to: *Lions of Illinois Foundation*. Donations are Tax Deductable.

## Entry Fees

**Adults:** \$20 per individual run/walker.

**High School Students and Younger:**

Entry fee is free, but each run/walker is encouraged to collect at least \$50 in donations.
