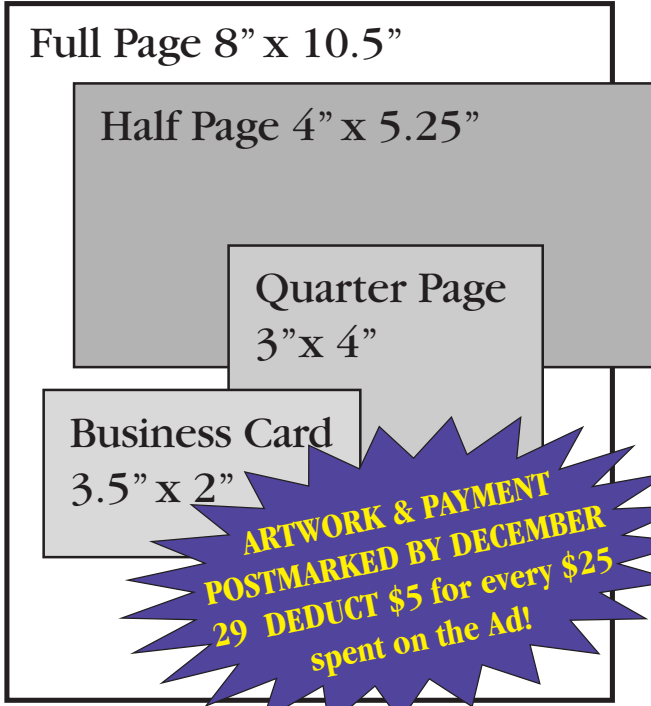

Greetings Lions:

I am looking forward to this year's District 1-F Convention and to serving as your 2015 Hospitality Room Chairman. The convention will be held at the Renaissance North Shore Hotel in Northbrook on March 6-8, 2015.

In keeping with the 2015 Lions Clubs International Convention destination, Honolulu, Hawaii, the theme for this year's hospitality area will be "Aloha Hawaii." If your club is sponsoring its own hospitality room or table(s) in the shared hospitality room, it would be nice to consider the theme in your decorating plans.

This is an opportunity for your club

to get creative and decorate Hawaiian-style. Food and/or beverages may be served, opportunities for fundraising, and games create interaction with convention attendees.

The hospitality area will be located on the lower level of the hotel. Hours for Friday and Saturday will be 8:30 p.m. until midnight.

There will be a shared District hospitality area for clubs to have tables and these may be reserved on the Hospitality Room form. In addition to club hospitality rooms, clubs and individuals will have an opportunity to show their support for our convention by sponsoring a table in this area. Sitting and cocktail tables will be placed throughout the shared hospitality room and hall tables will be just outside the rooms. Sponsor names will be prominently displayed.

Reservation forms and checks, payable to District 1-F with Hospitality Room/Table on the comment line, are due by February 20.

The Governor's Team will be given first choice of a room or table set. Clubs will be given their choice of room, table sets, etc., on a "first come, first served" basis. If there are any unreserved rooms or tables, clubs with paid reservations will be given a choice of those remaining rooms or tables. Should a conflict arise with room choice, it will be settled by a drawing.
