



## From Special Honors, to Canes for MS - Dinner Meeting Recap

With the Kelly Miller Circus rapidly approaching, our Elk Grove Lions Club's September dinner meeting focused on the October Candy Days. Lion Diane Millar asked members to underwrite the cost of a case or a half case of candy before Candy Days which will take place on Friday, October 10 and Saturday, October 11. Members were also asked to volunteer to man the various stations at particular times throughout those two days.



Lion Angie Foster presented Lion Barb Lahtinen with a special pin that belonged to Angie's late husband Ron. He is largely credited with mentoring Barb in her early years as a Lion, and he encouraged and inspired Barb in her drive towards becoming a governor.

Lion Mark Falejczyk then introduced guest speakers Dan and Mike Bober who spoke to the Lions about Team Chrissy, a group that organizes various fund raisers to help people with MS. Originally started as a family of eight members who organized an MS walk, Team Chrissy

has grown to a much larger group that hosts numerous fund raising events throughout the year. In addition to the walk, they have organized bowling, softball, travelling baseball, and golf tournaments. Team Chrissy also awards a couple of \$1,000 scholarships to local high school students toward their college tuition.



The latest program related to the Team Chrissy effort is called Canes for Chrissy. People are asked to decorate canes that will eventually be sold for the MS cause. Mr. Bober explained that Team Chrissy is able to help individuals much more quickly than the larger organizations that force people to go through a lot of red tape. After the Bober's talk had ended, President Rich presented them with a \$100 donation for Team Chrissy from our Lions Club.

Special note: It was great to see Lion Diana Marino back at our dinner meeting only three weeks after hip replacement surgery. Diana is one tough little Lion!
